I. MEETING CONVENED

Justice Borden called the meeting to order at approximately 3:35 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM THE MEETING OF MARCH 19, 2015

Carleton Giles moved to approve the minutes from the March 19th meeting. The minutes were approved by a unanimous voice vote.

III. RESOLUTIONS:

A. Proposal Formatting Changes

Atty. Moore explained that the Commission will utilize a resolution-based model for commission actions, proposals, and recommendations moving forward. The new model will improve the Commission's ability to track and archive commission action in the future.

B. Resolution Regarding State v. DeCiccio (R:2015-03)

Judge Devlin explained that the Sentencing Structure, Policy, and Practices Committee's recommendation regarding State v. DeCiccio, 315 Conn. 79 (2014) had been modified to address the ambiguity in drafting and subsequently approved by the Committee. Judge Devlin moved that resolution 2015-03 be adopted. The resolution was adopted by consensus.

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C. Resolution Regarding the Pew-MacArthur Results First Initiative (R: 2015-01)

Mr. Clark provided an overview of the resolution, the Pew-MacArthur Results First Initiative, and the how the Commission could benefit from a partnership. Justice Borden moved that resolution 2015-01 be adopted. The resolution was adopted by consensus).

D. Resolution Regarding a Study of Need and Risk-Based Sentencing (R: 2015-02)

Atty. Ullmann presented the Research Committee's proposal to invite researchers to conduct a study comparing pre-sentence risk and needs assessments with actual sentences imposed (R:2015-02). He explained that the Research Committee has worked on this proposal for several years and felt that the time was right to submit it to the Commission for consideration.

Discussion:

- Judge Carroll asked for clarification on the study's direction and whether it signified a step toward the creation of sentencing guidelines. Atty. Ullmann replied that the proposed study is not intended to investigate the feasibility of pursuing a guidelines system in Connecticut or as a means to hinder judicial independence.
- Judge Devlin asked why the dataset containing an individual's arrest and incarceration events would be limited to events that occurred two years prior to sentencing. Judge Devlin noted that superior court judges often look beyond this two-year period when reviewing an individual's arrest and incarceration events. He suggested that the two year constraint be removed from the invitation for proposals.
- Atty. Kane echoed Judge Devlin's remarks regarding the two-year time limitation on the dataset.

Atty. Kane moved that the invitation be amended to remove the two year limitation on the dataset. Atty. Ullmann accepted the amendment as friendly ("...will also include each individual's arrest and incarceration events for two **or more** years prior to sentencing...") and moved that resolution 2015-02 be adopted as amended. The resolution, as amended, was adopted by consensus.

Judge Devlin reported that the Sentencing Structure, Policy, & Practices Committee is examining the claim of right defense to robbery in light of the Connecticut Supreme Court's ruling in *State v. Tremaine Smith*, 317 Conn. 338 (2015).

Maureen Price-Boreland reported that the Recidivism Reduction Committee continues to work with the Research Committee to collect data from the Department of Correction on recidivism and inmate education.
